

Thomas A. DiPrete is professor of sociology and senior research fellow in the Center for Demographic Studies at Duke University, and research professor at the German Institute for Economic Research in Berlin. His primary research interests concern the consequences of national-level institutional arrangements for stratification and life course-related outcomes of individuals and families. His recent and current work includes comparisons of individual and household income dynamics in the U.S. and Germany, job mobility in the U.S., Germany, the Netherlands, and Sweden, unemployment dynamics in France and Sweden, the structure of wage trajectories and contingent work arrangements in France and the U.S., and how state policies and market arrangements affect fertility rates via their effect on the costs of raising children and the difficulty of combining childrearing and career in the U.S. and selected European societies.
